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
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Hollywood superstar John Cena sparked shock and outrage during a recent Colorado benefit concert headlined by legendary music icon Stevie Wonder.

hile Cena has never hidden his admiration for the multi-Grammy award winner, few were aware of just how big a fan of Peacemaker — a HBO Max show starring Cena — Wonder himself actually is. That's why the benefit's organizers secretly invited Cena to surprise the venerable headliner with a brief salute on the Red Rocks Amphitheater stage.

About halfway through the show, Cena came out to a huge ovation, before removing his shirt and flashing his trademark **U Can't C Me** hand gesture at the assembled crowd. Those cheers quickly turned to horrified gasps, however, once Cena turned and directed the gesture at Wonder. Almost instantly, the Doctor of Thuganomics was tackled to the ground by venue security and escorted backstage.

The controversial hand sign dates back to Cena's full-time wrestling days — a metaphor suggesting he's so far ahead of his rivals that they can't even see him.

"It's something I've been doing for years," Cena later explained. "But it was insensitive of me not to be more mindful of the context, here. I love and respect blind people, and I'm very sorry for my mistake."

Sources have informed us that the misunderstanding was quickly cleared up backstage, and laughs were had by all over the incident.



AEW LAUNCHES NEW AEW EROS LINE OF EROTIC FICTION BOOKS

EW President Tony Khan has announced the launch of a line of erotic fiction novels for young adults, under a new publishing imprint called AEW EROS.


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

But that's hardly original.



he New World Order (NWO) was a dominant professional wrestling stable — led by legends of the ring like 'Hollywood' Hulk Hogan, Kevin Nash and Scott Hall — that looked to take over their employer World Championship Wrestling (WCW) in the late 90s.

The faction also included a B-Team of midcarders made up of Stevie Ray, Scott Norton, Horace Hogan, Vincent and the late Bryan Adams — whose adventures were chronicled by ScoopThis in real time.

However, once WWE purchased and closed WCW in 2001 — extending invitations to NWO pillars Hogan, Nash and Hall only — the B-Team was left in limbo.

"That's just *some* of the depressing shit we've had to process," admitted Ray. "I mean, Bryan DIED. Then Horace joined that space cult in Nevada..."

"Wasn't a cult," mumbled Horace.

"Sucka, we found you living with 100 other people in a buried school bus thinking it's a space ship bound for Heaven or some shit," Ray replied.

"Mars," mumbled Horace.

As the story goes, the gang spent the next few years searching for purpose and meat sauce in all the wrong places.

"We had talks with other teams," Ray confirms. "But the NWO's a tough act to follow, know what I'm saying? The New Day just wanted to play video games, the Dark Order kept sexually harrassing Vincent, and I can't even tell you the sick shit the House of Black's into."

Ultimately, Ray claims that NJPW's Bullet Club turned out to be the perfect fit. "And by that, I mean they said yes."

When reached for comment, veteran BC members Luke Gallows and Karl Anderson confirmed that they had indeed adopted the B-Team on behalf of the Bullet Club, rechristening them the BC B-Team.

"Let's be honest, the Bullet Club's B-Team was pretty much me & Gallows until these guys showed up with this offer," argued Anderson. "How could we refuse? It'll be nice to have our bags carried for a change — and maybe they can help us scope out that haunted temple Gallows inherited in Kentucky."

espite a very publicized defection to rival promotion WWE last year, many AEW loyalists continue to allege that this is just another chapter in Cody Rhodes' slow burn heel turn.

what he calls *Caller Tampering*.

"They've stolen a tremendous amount of material from our show over the years,"
Stern claimed, "but enough is enough.
Hanzi is where I draw the line."

Hanzi refers to Imran Khan, a former Prime Minister of Pakistan who's got it going on, and has become a regular caller at POST Wrestling News & Reviews.

But even more famously, Hanzi is a member of Howard Stern's Wack Pack — an assortment of unusual personalities the show is famous for ridiculing — or rather was, before being banned for standing his ground and hitting Stern back with topics the former shock jock wasn't comfortable discussing on-air.

"The world's going to learn exactly what those two are up to," Stern promised, referring to POST hosts John Pollock & Wai Ting. "I don't know how they get more listeners than our own Sam Roberts; who's salt of the earth, plays by the rules and actually receives a paycheck from WWE," Stern continued ranting. "America must be filled with morons."

When reminded by co-host Robin Quivers that it was Stern himself that banned Hanzi in 2016, the 69 year-old host became even more animated.

"That's my Hanzi!" he exclaimed. "I made him! I say when he gets back on the air! I mean, who the hell are these guys? What kind of a name is Wai Ting? Am I crazy? What's going on, here?"

I Isaacs' Scoops (1997-2002) wasn't just one of the most popular pro wrestling rumors & news sites of its era, it also inspired the ScoopThis name. So were it not for Scoops, you might be reading MicasaThis right now.

Scoops was also the driving force behind Break The Barrier (1999) - the original Forbidden Door — a wrestling show involving 12 different promotions held at the legendary Viking Hall (a.k.a. ECW Arena) in Philadelphia, PA in front of a thousand screaming fans.

Additionally, Al created Smarks — a wrestling-themed comic strip currently being adapted into an animated series (Slamm'd) — before enjoying a successful 15-year run as one half of popular east coast comedy duo Isaacs & Baker.

Today, Al celebrates 27 years of marriage to beautiful wife Theresa — who once punched Tom Brandi in the mouth as a shoot — while teaching improv comedy seminars at Hofstra University, and raising their teenage son Nick on Long Island, NY.

Al also recently learned he was adopted, and is writing a book about the search for a birth mother & half-sister he didn't know existed until one year ago.

The friendship between indie wrestling legends Gen 'LuFisto' Goulet & Marc-Andre 'Beast King FTM' Boulanger extends over 25 yrs.

he pair — then respectively known as Lucy Fer & Franky The Mobster, - originally met in 1997 at Église Notre-Dame-des-Sept-Douleurs in Verdun, QC for a show held by Alain Field's Royal Wrestling Ring (RWR) that both had been invited to work.

"I thought she was fire, so I put some pressure on Northern Championship Wrestling (NCW) to bring her in," recalls Beast King. "And she did great with us."

In 1999, both wrestlers walked out of NCW over their desire to work abroad.

"I eventually returned, but she kept trailblazing her way to the great career we all saw her have. [LuFisto ranked #390 in 2022's famed PWI 500 after ranking Top 50 on the women's side for 13 straight years.] That type of solidarity is why we'll always be there for one another."

According to LuFisto, the pair did a lot of growing up together, despite the ever-varying distances between them.

"Like me, Beast King has always been passionate about everything he does," she points out. "He's someone that I know I can turn to for anything. He's kinda the brother I never had."

CONDUCTED SHORTLY AFTER HIS RECENT RETIREMENT -

A candid conversation with the former WWE CEO about dwindling viewership, uninspired creative, 3-hour Raws, Katie Vick, Vince Russo, Nick Khan & more.

ince McMahon doesn't give many interviews, but there was no one we wanted to speak with more for this very special Black Issue.

Our thanks and appreciation for doing this, it's an honor.

Not a problem. Pat [Patterson] was a fan – back when you guys, y'know, mattered – and made me promise to do this once I finally retire from running things. Which

was, of course, going to be *never*... but plans change, as they say. Besides, it's not like anyone's going to actually *read* this, right? I mean, haven't you guys been gone for over two decades? How'd that mainstream relaunch work out? [Laughs]

Wow.

Your current irrelevance is *freeing*, is all I mean. [Laughs] Ah, c'mon, pal... lighten up! Should make for an even better interview. Lay it in. I'm ready. Let's go.

bodybuilding federation, a supplements line, a broadway restaurant, a music label, a film studio, a football league... it seems whenever WWE business peaks, you're building rafts. Why this obsession with other shores?

Ah. You'd think it would be obvious at this point, but the simple truth is... I just hate professional wrestling.

Wait, what?

It's so freeing to finally get to say it: I hate wrestling, and always have. The media won't touch it, the fans are uneducated sheep, and most workers are morally bankrupt narcissists. My own father wouldn't give me the time of day until I got involved with it. What part of that am I supposed to love, exactly?

Then why not step away sooner? Qualified, motivated people have been patiently waiting in the wings for years.

You just answered your own question: they're *qualified*, and could potentially turn things around. If there's one thing those failed businesses taught me, it's that as long as there's a WWE — whether I'm a part of it or not — its shadow looms too large for me to ever experience doing something I actually enjoy, in an industry I'm not ashamed of, for an audience I don't despise.

That is equal parts shocking, sociopathic, and moving.

Told you this would be good! [Laughs] Been trying to sink this ship for decades; and almost succeeded with those early 90s occupational gimmicks.

Indeed. But after narrowly avoiding bankruptcy, WWE rebounded in a big way during the late 90s Attitude Era.

[Sighs] I have only myself to blame, there. I could've just waited things out — the iceberg was right there in front of us, all I had to do was *literally nothing* — but I might've gotten a little cocky and tried speeding things up by letting a fan from Long Island write the show for a while.

I assume you mean Vince Russo.

That's the one. [My wife] Linda insisted

I hear him out. He had crazy ideas like bringing backstage rivalries on-screen, blurring face/heel dynamics, and letting our superstars talk like regular people... utter lunacy. So I put him in charge of creative, confident the end was near.

Except the audience was actually into Russo's controversial brand of Crash TV.

Into it, you say? He more than tripled our audience! The show had never seen ratings that high. Adding insult to injury, he was taking credit for it on the internet. People were starting to get the idea that any fan could just walk in off the street and write a better show than I can, based solely on the fact that that's essentially what happened. In the end, unleashing Vince Russo on the world may be my biggest regret, after financing Knucklehead.

So you fired him?

Didn't have to — just gave him a second weekly show to write for no additional pay and watched him run to WCW. [Laughs] With Russo gone, I could resume the sabotage; and before long, I had Mae Young giving birth to a hand, Trish Stratus barking like a dog in her underwear...

...and Triple H literally humping the corpse of Kane's dead girlfriend just to get under his skin.

And those are just the ideas my daughter didn't veto! [Laughs]

Now I'll admit, we *might've* crossed a line or two with the Katie Vick stuff — in my defense, I felt it would take something particularly vile to turn off an audience built by Vince Russo — ultimately, all this did was arouse suspicions from within the company; and I knew they'd soon be on to me unless I found a way to dilute the source of these poison pill ideas.

Is this when you decided to hire 30 writers to do the job you expected Russo [and assistant Ed Ferrara] to do?

Not too long after that, yes. I also made sure new writers knew as little about the industry as possible — bonus points if they shared my contempt for it. [Laughs] So for the next few years, we insulted the audience's intelligence as best we could: Stuttering Matt Morgan, the ECW Zombie, Eugene... I even booked myself in a match against God, and won!

Nevertheless, the audience persisted; and though not what they'd been under Russo's watch, ratings remained surprisingly stable throughout the Ruthless Aggression Era. It wasn't until Raw went PG in July 2008 that we saw them even begin to trend downward again.

Turns out boring the audience is much more effective at driving it away than offending it ever was. Who knew? Wish I'd thought of it sooner. So I can't take credit for that one, as we were forced into the PG era by extraneous circumstances.

I assume you're referring to the Chris Benoit double-murder suicide.


I don't know who that is. However, what I do know is that with ratings finally dipping again, we had to strike while the iron was hot: so the next step was to make John Cena — the most boring character we had on the roster — the face of the company.

A decision that was soundly rejected by fans; not just at the time, but for the length of his run with the company.

The WWE Universe made it pretty clear with that reaction that John was the perfect champion to deliver the message that WWE will never be compelling again. So the less they wanted him, the more I put him out there. And just when it seemed like people couldn't stomach another minute of him, came the final coup-de-grâce...

...that's the one! [Laughs] 50% more Cena! This would test the intestinal fortitude of even the most dedicated WWE loyalist.



Well played, I guess — because ratings quickly resumed their post-Russo slide.

Thank you, but I couldn't have done it without a full team of unqualified nepotism hires far too intimidated to question me.

Once again, all I had to do was just wait things out — and having learned my lesson with the Russo error, I did — until an unexpected monkeywrench from Saudi Arabia got thrown into those plans.

I'll admit I didn't know or care who Nick Khan was, but I did care about the XFL. So it was a pretty easy decision to make.

Khan then used his social network to secure one great deal after another for


the company, helping to make WWE more profitable than ever; despite the excellent job you were doing tanking the ratings.

Well, that's all the time we have — Join us next week when Kane joins Rock for cooking and karaoke! ●





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
